Message from the Principal



Greetings Putnam Students, Parents, and Families!

Welcome back! I hope you had an enjoyable Fall Break! We are looking forward to continued student growth during the upcoming months. Our staff has done a tremendous job keeping our kids safe while maintaining high quality instruction. We will continue to follow all PSD safety protocols to ensure our kids maintain uninterrupted learning.

Our staff and district continue our focus on Belonging and Acceleration. PSD is supporting Acceleration through improvement of practices in Reading. At Putnam, our staff meetings have provided time for teachers and teams to learn more about evidence-based practices in Reading. At our Collaboration Day in November, we discussed the relationship of a student's ability to read and write with oral language development. Last month, in our newsletter we began this conversation with learning about one of the main components for reading called Phonological Awareness (PA). Phonological Awareness is the ability to hear, recognize and manipulate spoken parts of sentences and words. This month we'll talk about Oral Language development. Oral Language development influences a student's ability to speak and write. We can increase reading and writing skills through our development of oral

language and vocabulary. For example, activities that can increase oral language and vocabulary include hearing a variety of words, being active in everyday conversations, sharing oral stories, reading books with your child, singing and playing rhyming games, and having varied experiences. Each of these activities builds oral language development, vocabulary, and phonological awareness. For more information on PA and Oral Language development, check out the website readingrockets.org. As we move through the year, I'll continue to provide instructional updates like this one to keep families up to date on learning in the classroom.



AT HOME COVID-19 SYMPTOM SCREENING TOOL FOR PARENTS AND STAFF

Parents and guardians can use these symptom checklists to determine when to keep their child at home. School staff can also use this tool to determine if they need to stay at home. Any student or staff diagnosed with COVID-19 or who is a close contact of a COVID-19 case should not go to school and should isolate or quarantine according to public health recommendations regardless of current symptoms.

This symptom screen refers only to new symptoms or a change in usual symptoms. A student/staff should not be kept home for usual symptoms they experience due to a chronic condition unless they are worse than usual. These guidelines are in addition to your regular school guidance (for example, a child with vomiting should also not attend school based on usual school guidance). Please refer to the Return to Learn guidance to determine when it is appropriate to return to school. If your child is/you are experiencing any potentially life-threatening symptoms, please call 911.

Symptom Screen: If any of the following symptoms are present, keep the child at home/stay at home, inform the school of symptoms, and reach out to a health care provider about COVID-19 testing and next steps for treatment. ☐ Feeling feverish, having chills, or temperature 100.4°F or higher. ☐ New or unexplained persistent cough. ☐ Shortness of breath. ☐ Difficulty breathing. ☐ Loss of taste or smell. ☐ Fatigue. ☐ Muscle aches. ☐ Headache. ☐ Sore throat. ☐ Nausea or vomiting. ☐ Diarrhea. ☐ Runny nose or congestion.

STOP, WALK, TALK

Students are learning and participating in our Positive Behavior Interventions & Support campaign; Stop, Walk, Talk. Posters are posted around the school as a reminder to use Stop, Walk, Talk if students are having a conflict with another student.

Stop, Walk, Talk



Ask them to:

STOP

Tell them you don't like the problem behavior and ask them to STOP.



Next

WALK

Walk away from the problem behavior.



If the problem behavior doesn't stop:

TALK

Talk to an adult.
